

PROMOTING FROM THE EVENT - THE NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ABORTED CHILDREN

1. If you have a **Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter, or other social media account, you can update your status and post/tweet** about the NDR event while it's occurring. If you have a smart phone or tablet you can do this from the gravesite or memorial. (*see samples page*)
2. You can share news or enthusiasm about the event and you can **add one of the following links to your post...**

3. You can take **pictures or videos** with your smart phone and post to Facebook during the event. Invite others to “like” and “share.” (If you bring a camera, you can still post online afterward.)
4. You can **post pictures to online galleries**, such as Flickr, Shutterfly, or those at online news sites...you may need to register for a free account to submit photos and stories.
5. You can **post stories/blogs/commentaries and pictures on Patch.com** at a local “board” – you will need to register for a free account or you can choose to sign in with Facebook. Not all communities have Patch sites, but Patch is present in a growing number of communities in 23 states and there are many hyperlocal media sites. (To learn more about hyperlocal media visit <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hyperlocal>).
6. You can **call in tips to area television and radio newsrooms**. You can often find news tip hotline phone numbers on broadcast outlet websites.

SAMPLE CALL to a news tip hotline:

“Hi. Do you know about this big gathering out at (name of cemetery or memorial site)? There’s a gravesite here for aborted babies and at (time) there is going to be a National Day of Remembrance ceremony here. It’s part of the National Day of Remembrance taking place across the country at nearly 400 gravesite and memorials for babies killed by abortion.”

7. You can **email or post tips, photos, and videos to area television and radio newsrooms**. Email addresses and submittal forms can be accessed via broadcast outlet websites.

SAMPLE EMAIL to newsrooms:

Subject: NEWSTIP – (name of town)

There’s a large crowd assembling at (name of cemetery or memorial site), out in the (area specifics). In a little over an hour, at (time), there’s going to be a memorial service for the aborted babies that are buried there and (list well known speaker name) is going to be there. It’s part of the National Day of Remembrance taking place across the country at nearly 400 gravesite and memorials for babies killed by abortion. You type this part of your post, using a video that already exists on YouTube, GodTube, Vimeo, or another site, or post your own taken via cell phone from a memorial site.

Check out this video showing one memorial to aborted children, There are 37 burial sites across the US for these babies that were killed in the womb, and 360 memorials that honor these innocents. Visit <http://abortionmemorials.com>.



Abortion memorial site: The Crosses Witness to Death
This video pans a long line of crosses that mark each of several hundred tiny babies killed by an abortion. The bodies of these innocent victims are buried in a mass grave just beyond the ridge. Recovered from a medical waste dock in 1988, a Christian funeral service was conducted.

This part - graphic and text - come directly from the link when you type it in...and will show up when you post your message.

You can post a picture on Facebook and tell your FB friends what it is all about. Take your own photos to post or "like" and share pictures from <https://www.facebook.com/abortionmemorials>



On LinkedIn, you can post to groups you already belong to, or seek out new ones - based on area of interest or geography...or you can simply update your status.



You can tweet invites, updates, and links, but you are allowed a maximum of 140 characters. Use hash tags (#) to mark key topics, ideas, and places, so that your tweets will appear in searches and discussions. Suggestions: #remembertheaborted #life #stopabortion #abortion #pro-life #nationaldayofremembrance #unborn #hillside (or any other memorial location)

You can post pictures with captions (stories, too) at hyperlocal media. You may have to register (it's free). Upload your photo, select the date, town, gallery, add the caption and don't forget to hit "submit"

HINT: Make links names short at tinyurl.com or bitly.com so you can save characters and have more room to say something!

Patch.com is made for posting YOUR stories and pictures. Select your town, register (it's free), and post on the Boards (opinion, announcements, breaking news). This is great way to tell the National Day of Remembrance story in your own words.
